
Drunk At Christmas

Trad. James Down Manuscript Chord suggestions by Ian Bell



In the early 1980s I learned this tune from a large manuscript inscribed "James Down Oxford Mills, Ingersoll, Canada West, April 15, 1862". I have since misplaced the written music but have transcribed it here from my own playing.

It's a fairly common tune in both the Scottish and Irish fiddle and bagpipe repertoire, although it usually goes by the more demure names of "Christmas Carousing" or "What We Did at Christmas".

Aside from two original tunes, the rest of the book consisted of 109 Scottish strathspeys and reels, and it gave the inpression of perhaps having been copied wholesale from a published collection rather than pieced together one tune at a time over the years.
